Thank you to those who attended we have collated all of the feedback and it will be presented to the Board with recommendations on how we can improve on this process.

A quick snap-shot of the results are:

- 275 registered attendees, with attendance from all regions.
- 80 survey respondents- 79 valid surveys (one completed by a member who did not attend)
- 97.53% would like to see a conference held in the future
- 2.47% would like another format considered
- 16.5% would like another location to be considered- potentially out of Sydney

Overall, the Conference was everything we hoped it would be, and we were excited to run an event that featured volunteer speakers.
