Hackathon idea presented to help improve communication

One of our members, Steve Cliffe, attended the Hackathon with an aim to address an ongoing issue that was identified in the 2014 Roadshow around how we are communicated with. He presented an idea to help address this issue by enabling a subscription based email service that would:

- Let members choose what they want to receive (topic based subscription)
- Let members choose how they want to receive it (via their member email, personal email or via their Unit)

The aim was to develop a simple web-based form to show how this could look as a "proof of concept". If the Service liked it, then it could be developed further.
